Our Programs

01 | Education - Materials

We place essential school materials directly into the hands of children and the teachers who help them learn; important tools like notebooks, pencils, rulers, crayons, glue and more, tools that make learning possible.

02 | Health - Menstrual+

We provide reusable menstrual health kits to girls in remote areas of Uganda where access to menstrual care and education is often nonexistent, helping them stay in school with consistency and dignity.

01 | Education Support

We identify under served communities, schools, and trusted NGOs and provide essential educational materials and menstrual health kits to promote literacy, dignity, and community engagement.

03 | Literacy Incentives

We encourage literacy and creativity through global connection—elevating children's voices via our Pen pal Program and annual Literary Tournament, where participation builds confidence and dreams are penned to paper.

02 | Impactful Partnerships

Our work is powered by donors and local nonprofit partners who share our belief in education and help extend kindness to children through meaningful, collaborative action.



04 | Elevating Kindness



School Materials

We entered 2025 knowing it had the potential to be our strongest year yet. By planning purchases well in advance, we are able to take advantage of lower costs during off-peak seasons; an approach that requires fundraising ahead of delivery and careful alignment between resources and distribution timelines.

This year significantly tested our logistical capacity, as we **quadrupled** the volume of materials distributed across multiple countries. Successfully meeting that challenge was only possible through the strength of our local partnerships. In Uganda, our primary partner, Empathy Children Initiative, played a critical role by supporting storage and coordinating timely local purchases. In Peru, Jose and Cecilia LópezRevoredo, Esmeralda Tarazona, Tito Ayra and all school directors were instrumental across every stage of procurement and delivery.

Our ability to reach thousands of children globally is built on these trusted relationships, and we are deeply grateful to everyone who contributed to making our 2025 operations successful.


Our Year in Review Uganda

2025 marked Dear Future's largest impact in Uganda to date, driven by a new approach that focused on high-need government schools. In Eastern Uganda, we partnered with Empathy Children to help Lukungu, Mbirabira, and Luwerere Primary Schools, each serving over 800 students in conditions of extreme poverty.

Students received essential learning tools—six notebooks, pencils, a sharpener, and an eraser, addressing the immediate absence of basic materials, while schools received shared supplies including extra pencils, crayons, rulers, and chalk.

School Materials

This model allowed us to support 4,002 students across Uganda, including 3500 in government schools; challenging logistics but informing how our plans should grow.

Empathy Children Initiative Uganda NGO



One of our visits in Eastern Uganda included a stop at Empathy Children Initiative's home in Mayuge. Led by [Henry Katinda](#), ECI supports more than 50 children, providing daily care, education support, tuition, and medical assistance, including ongoing care and medication for many children living with HIV+ diagnosis.

Empathy Children Initiative has become a cornerstone of Dear Future's work in Uganda, and we are proud to continue this journey together in service of children and their futures.



Western Uganda Kigali District

We began working in Western Uganda alongside longtime friend of the organization and NGO founder [Elly Guard Tumusiime](#). In his role as Local Council 1 (LC1) community leader, Elly coordinated the distribution of school materials to 500 students across local government schools, prioritizing those with the greatest need.

Through his leadership position, Elly has direct insight into local school systems and is able to identify and respond effectively to gaps in access. As he seeks election to LC5 Regional Leader, this partnership has the potential to expand Dear Future's reach even further across the region. We wish him success and look forward to the opportunities ahead.

More Than a Game

In 2025, Dear Future delivered soccer equipment to 80+ children at the Empathy Children orphanage in Eastern Uganda in two separate visits. For many of these children, the jerseys, shorts, cleats, and training gear were far beyond anything they had ever imagined owning.

In much of Africa, football is more than a sport, it is a shared language, a source of joy, and a pathway to confidence and belonging. Seeing the children put on their kits for the first time was a powerful reminder that dignity, play, and opportunity matter just as much as classroom tools.

This initiative was made possible through our collaboration with [Pablo Futsal Academy](#), whose community helped collect the majority of the equipment. Together, we were able to create moments of pure happiness, and memories that will last far beyond the field.



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


Health Reusable Hygienic Pads



2025 was an inspiring year for our menstrual health program.

Despite fundraising challenges, we supported **711 girls**, 481 of them with reusable **AFRIpads**, fully emptying our remaining supply of disposable pads.

Transitioning from disposable to reusable products meant serving fewer girls initially, as a reusable kit costs **5x** more upfront. However, the long-term impact is significant: while a disposable pack *may* last up to 1 month, a reusable AFRIpads kit can last at least two years, extending support from 30 days to 24 months.

We are proud of our partnership with Empathy Children Initiative and deeply grateful to **Patience Nakamya**, whose dedication and instruction have empowered hundreds of girls with knowledge, dignity, and confidence.

Menstrual Health Program – Survey Insights

In 2025, we conducted a survey among girls ages 10–16 in primary grades up to P7 who received reusable AFRIpads. While the standard age for P7 is 12–13, many respondents were older, reflecting delayed grade progression common in under served communities.


The survey revealed several significant findings:

- **Reduced absenteeism**, confirming that access to reusable menstrual products helps girls stay in school.
- **High satisfaction** with the usability of AFRIpads, including wearing, washing, drying, and storage.
- **Strong positive feedback** on the quality and clarity of the menstrual health training provided.
- **A clear desire for continued education**, with girls expressing interest in additional discussions and future training sessions.


These findings reinforce both the effectiveness of reusable menstrual products and the importance of pairing distribution with education.






When using the AFRIpads, how comfortable did you feel?

New schools, new students, same mission!

Our work in Peru continued to grow in 2025, expanding from 7 schools in 2024 to 11 schools in 2025 and increasing the number of students served by 92. This year marked an important milestone with the addition of the Cusco region to our program.

Beginning in San Francisco de Colcha, located approximately three hours south of Cusco, we reached children living in some of the most remote and under served communities in the Andes. Supporting schools in this region exemplifies Dear Future's **global mission**: to bring education and essential resources to children living in isolated areas where access to basic school materials remains limited.

Why Cusco?

Since 2023, Dear Future has been exploring opportunities to expand our work into the Cusco region, an area widely known to the world, yet home to many remote and hard-to-reach communities. In the Andes, poverty does not discriminate, and access to education is often determined by distance from commercial and urban centers.

While need exists throughout the Andean region, Cusco offers a unique balance. Unlike more isolated areas, it remains accessible while still reaching deeply rural communities, creating opportunities not only for meaningful impact but also for future engagement and visitation that can strengthen long-term support for our mission.



The price of education

In parts of the Andes, including Cusco, children often cross wide, dangerous rivers alone just to reach school. In communities without bridges, this journey is made using an OROYA, a small cable basket pulled by hand across the river.



In 2023, Dear Future built Trey Junior School in collaboration with (then) the Namugga Mable Foundation; on the first day, we entrusted its management and growth to the (now) NM Foundation. What began with **83 students** has grown into a thriving learning community of **400 children**. We are proud to have been part of its foundation and to witness the remarkable growth that has followed.

Feb 2026 - Update from Executive Director, Eve Namusisi:

"The first phase of construction was very successful, laying a strong foundation for the continued growth of Trey Junior School. We now serve 400 children who are learning in an increasingly supportive and structured environment. Academically, the students have made steady progress, and this year we are proud to have learners promoted to the candidate class. To further strengthen performance, we have engaged additional facilitators who are actively supporting and preparing our students for their national examinations."

Trey Junior School is proof that when a foundation is laid with care, the future rises far beyond what we first imagined.

Empathy Community High School

From a dream in 2022 to opening its doors in February 2026, Empathy Community High School stands as a testament to perseverance and partnership. Built alongside Empathy Children Initiative through two years marked by inflation, supply challenges, and funding uncertainty, the school now prepares to welcome more than 250 students, with plans to grow as support continues. We are deeply proud to be partners in bringing secondary education to the remote regions of Eastern Uganda.

Feb 2026, below is an update from the school's Director, Henry Katinda:

"When construction began, the land was empty but the vision was strong: to create a secondary school that would serve vulnerable children in Mayuge who otherwise might not continue their education. In February 2026, Empathy Community High School will officially open its doors. Students are registering in encouraging numbers as we begin our first academic year, starting with Senior one and two.

We are deeply grateful to Dear Future International and all our partners whose steadfast support made this milestone possible despite challenges throughout the year. Their commitment has helped turn vision into reality. This is just the beginning, and we look forward to growing together as we expand access to quality secondary education in eastern Uganda."
